

**LGAA Monthly Meeting: May 10, 2017**

1. Cherokee Nation Tribal Council candidate, Michelle Scarborough was scheduled to attend but was unable to make it. April told us a little about her and that she has been able to speak with her about the laws dealing with the Native American Art. The law is not being enforced at this time due to a law suit in California.
2. Betty handed out the printed sheets for the Treasurer's Report. The balance forward was \$2677.21. Credits included t-shirt sales of \$60, a donation from Clark May for \$50, Ad sales of \$202, and reimbursements from the Chamber for 1/2 of the Cowan plaque for \$73.50 and 1/2 of the PSO deposit for \$93.00. The debits included reimbursement to Jennifer Henson for the ballet expenses of \$25.43, the deposit for the City of LG (PWA) for water and sewer for \$150, and the LGAA Scholarship to Sydney Schwichtenberg for \$500. The new balance to carry forward is \$2333.28.
3. In the report for the Newsletter, Roxann reported that Tara had been the focused member and asked who was next. Pam Glass is to be next.
4. In the discussion of the news writer for the school related arts news, Melissa McClendon had been asked about doing it, she is going to think about it and get back with Betty. Would begin with the beginning of school in the fall.
5. The Founder's Day Art Show is well into the works. Betty is doing brochures, there are 27 plus one added today making it 28 artists in the show. 8 to 10 new people. The Silent auction is more of a silent bid with envelopes for the bids to be placed to keep them as blind bids. Jess Dinsmore donated some of his wood works to the auction. Jerry is finishing up the cutting board for the raffle. Clean up and set up of tables to happen on Friday evening. Pam Quantie is going to be helping Betty with things during the show. The building will be open at 8:30 on Saturday morning for booth set up with the hours of the show being 10 am to 4pm. David's fire walk is to take place at 10:30.
6. Shaun reported that the Mystery exhibit is still up at the Museum and that there will be Chalk Art contest during Founder's Day in front of the resale shop.

In open discussion, Kelly pointed out the need for a printer in the new building. She was to get a couple of quotes with maintenance agreements. Mark will be able to fix us up with a computer to go with it.

The mural created by High School students Sydney Schwichtenberg and Cole Bryant on the building wall of the new building was done in a fashion so that each year it could be added to by other high school students. Ray is finished with the painting of the windows. There was also discussion of original art being displayed in the building with the possibility of having a showcase artist that changes periodically. Ray has the new FVW sign done as well and it is up. Arron has his second book completed and looking forward to the work on the third one.
