Members of the Locust Grove Arts Alliance (LGAA) met Wednesday, July 10 at the LGAA office on Main Street.

After the discussion of the June meeting about voting to pay for the electrical upgrade that will be needed to help refurbish the VFW building, the vote passed on the \$2100 bid received.

Charlie and Letitia Keene brought a painting of the Bryant Chapel Church for the art sale which LGAA will have July 19. Price of the painting is \$200 or make an offer. This sale will also be to help in the VFW renovations.

Ray Grass described a painting he has just finished for the sale. The painting is of a Cherokee man in ceremonial dress.

Betty Perkins brought a copy of the Lindsey Mayes Bridge photo and a fabric creation of a flag that looks to be flying in the wind. She also has some smaller pieces she plans to bring.

Other LGAA members are expected to be getting their artwork for the sale. Artwork should be in the office by July 15 to have time for the exhibit.

The exhibit/sale is just one of several things planned for July 19 which includes the return of the DJ's food truck. Marcia Payne will be parking the truck in the old In and Out area at the stop light. Other events planned are jam session led by Tristan Cook and others at the Wonder City Coffee, and magic shows sponsored by The Magic Showplace at the Rabbit in the Hole throughout the evening.
